


## Q1 Which site do you use? (You can tick more than one)



## Q2 How often do you use the Health Centre?



### Q3 What is your most common reason for visiting the Health Centre?



### Q4 How long does it currently take for you to travel from your home to the Health Centre?



## Q5 How long will it take for you to travel from your home to Jordanthorpe Health Centre?







160	<p>I had an appointment at the Jordanthorpe building in 2012 and I've been to have another look at it. Despite what you say in your FAQs, I believe there's not enough parking for all people likely to want or need to use their cars for the two GP services, the pharmacy, and whatever other services are offered. This will become more of an issue when the promised extra improved services become available. Traffic and parking on nearby roads is likely to increase and could cause problems for the route 75, other bus services, other road users and local residents. Also, Meadowgreen patients driving to/from Jordanthorpe will add to and get caught in traffic congestion around Meadowhead which could become worse once the new retail park opens (very soon) on Bochum Parkway. As you and the CCG and others such as Sheffield Council should know, bus services to/from Jordanthorpe Health Centre are poor or non-existent for Meadowgreen patients. The M17 service is only hourly, starts late, finishes before 6.00pm (4.00pm Saturdays), doesn't run on Sundays and doesn't go near where many patients live. The bus service along Greenhill Avenue (busy with commuter and other traffic) to Meadowhead was stopped years ago (although bus stops and a bus shelter are still there). The CCG and Sheffield Council should not support this re-location of Meadowgreen without better bus services. Regard should be had to the Council's new Transport Strategy and new Green City Strategy which, among other things, are aimed at reducing journeys, reducing use of cars, reducing vehicle emissions that damage health, and increasing use of public transport and healthy alternatives such as cycling and walking. Regarding the NHS and CCG, mentioned in your FAQs, I've looked on the CCG website for information about Meadowgreen and support for this re-relocation in the context of up-to-date local NHS/CCG health strategy, health service plans and financial plans. All I could find was under Neighbourhoods "click on your GP Practice below to find out which Neighbourhood they belong to, and more information", which was of no use at all. No information (e.g. from the CCG) has been given on other possible options for re-organising and improving and keeping Meadowgreen GP services on the west side of Chesterfield Road. A few years ago, we were informed that consideration was being given to combining the Old School Practice with the Avenue Medical Practice. Something along those lines for people in Greenhill, Bradway and Lowedges might be better and more sensible than forcing people to go to Jordanthorpe. Furthermore, following the recent widespread objections to concentrating walk-in and minor injury services at Northern General Hospital (miles away), I thought the NHS and CCG might instead plan to locate these services away from NGH in local areas in co-ordination with GP Practices. But there's no sign of that happening. So, and in the absence of publicly available information, I've got no confidence that this Meadowgreen re-location has been well thought out. What it looks like is a way of making more use, even if its in the wrong location for Meadowgreen patients, of a fairly new NHS building that for some reason has been underused for years. Regarding fitness for purpose of the present buildings you refer to 'issues' raised in recent CQC reports. That seems to me a bit misleading. The last report (December 2016) on the CQC website mentions a few minor but no big urgent issues about the buildings. The GP practice managed those minor issues well and had some improvements in mind. The whole service was rated 'good'. As a local resident I'm also very concerned about what might happen to the school site and building in what is or should be a conservation area. 

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## Q12 What is your gender?



### Q13 Is your gender identity different to the sex you were assumed to be at birth?





## Q18 Do you consider yourself to have a disability?




